



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1. A candidate will not be allowed to take any other subjects involving practical in the STD XII if he / she had not taken that subject in STD XI.

2. A candidate will be allowed to change the optional subjects within one month from the date of commencement of the school, provided that the change can be accommodated in the time table and is permitted by the Principal.





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As soon as admission is granted, the applicant will have to pay the full fees for the academic year. Unless such payment is condoned or allowed to differ, the admission is liable to be cancelled. When differed payment of fees is permitted by the Principal, the student will have to pay a fine of Rs. 10/- per week; the amount of such fine will be credited to the building fund account.

GENERAL INFORMATION - ADMISSION CRITERIA

A candidate seeking admission to any of the faculty should apply online through the school website: www.meffatimaponda.com. once the online admission is accepted, he / she will have to pay offline fees to confirm the admission for the academic year 2024-2025.

- The candidate must present himself / herself along with his / her Parents / Guardian with the application form duly completed, to the Principal.
- 2) The following documents are required to be submitted:
 - a. Admission form duly completed
 - b. The S.S.C. mark sheet in original along with the photocopy duly attested.
 - c. Two copies of recent photograph.
 - d. Original school leaving certificate.
 - e. Character certificate from the head of the school last attended.
 - f. Undertaking by the student and Parent / Guardian in the prescribed form attached to admission form along with the photograph of the Parent / Guardian.
- 3) A candidate who has passed the S.S.C. exam or its equivalent from a board other than Goa Board must produce from Goa Board:
 - a. Transfer / leaving certificate in original duly countersigned by the concerned education officer.
 - b. Attested photocopy of statement of marks.
 - c. Attested photocopy of passing certificate.
 - d. Migration certificate in original.

(Please note that if the ABOVE documents are not produced with the stipulated time (i.e. before the declaration of STD XI examination results) the results of such candidates will be kept RESERVED by Goa Board in absence of eligibility certificate and parent / candidate will be held responsible for the lapse)

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GENERAL INFORMATION - ADMISSION CRITERIA

- 4) No admission shall be regarded as duly granted unless:
- a. It is confirmed by the authority.
- b. The necessary fees have been paid.
- c. The admission is approved by the Goa Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education, Alto Porvorim.
- 5) Candidate applying for other professional courses should inform the Principal in writing at the time of admission & should subsequently submit the proof of admission.
- 6) The Principal has full authority to refuse admission to a student, depending on the character and general conduct of the student. The decision of the Principal will be final and binding.

Identity card

Every student must obtain an I-Card from the school office & must wear the I-Card during school hours, examination and programs / functions and must produce it whenever asked for, and must return to school when leaving the school. If lost, a duplicate I-Card must be obtained from the school office by paying a fine.

Laboratory Work

The laboratory is well equipped with all the modern equipments under the supervision of well qualified and experienced staff.









The library has good collection of books, periodicals and newspapers. The students are encouraged to make full use of library facilities, subject to the rules which govern the smooth working of the library and which will be displayed on the notice board. Books will be issued only on producing of library cards which every student should necessarily possess.

ATTENDANCE

A regular student appearing for an examination to be held in March / April / October is required to put in minimum attendance of 75% of the working days from the commencement of the same academic year till 20 days prior to the commencement of the first theory / practical / oral examination of the schedule.

The Chairman / Principal of the board / school is vested the powers to condone the deciency of the attendance upto 15% of the total requirement, if such a request is made on the following grounds:

a. Prolonged illness, duly certified by registered medical practitioner.

b. Loss of father / mother or some such other incident, leading to absence from school and which merits this type of special consideration.

c. Any other reasons of similar serious nature.

From the above it is clear that a student with attendance below 60% cannot be sponsored nor admitted for the respective examination and such cases should not be referred to the Board for condonation of attendance.



RULES AND REGULATIONS

1) All the students are answerable to the Principal for their general conduct both inside and outside the school.

2) The student should wear proper school uniform pattern as prescribed by the school. Those students not wearing the proper uniform will not be allowed to attend the regular classes.

3) The hair style should be decent and to the satisfaction of the school authorities. Students should not keep long nails as during practicals harmful chemicals may get accumulated inside and can be harmful to health.

4) Students should wear I-card daily and carry school prospectus / calendar daily and produce it as and when demanded by school authorities.

5) The student shall abide by the rules that may be enforced by the Principal of the school from time to time and shall do nothing inside or outside the campus of the school that will interfere with its administration and mode of functioning.

6) Conduct of student in the class rooms as well as in the premises or the campus of the school shall be such that it will cause no disturbance to the other students or to other classes, programmes or activities.

7) The students are expected to take proper care of the school property and help in keeping the premises neat and clean. Any damage done to the school property will be viewed as a breach of discipline and will attract disciplinary action.

8) Parents / Guardians and visitors will not be allowed to meet their children / wards during the school hours.

9) In order to maintain a rapport with the teachers and know about the progress of the child, the parents are required to meet the teachers.

10) If the student is absent for one lecture / practical, he / she will be marked absent for the day. If the child is remaining absent for any reason a leave note must be submitted to the class teacher and record of the same must be entered in the school calendar.

11) Minimum 75% of attendance, separately for theory and practical is compulsory to appear for the examination, failure of which will be dealt seriously by school authorities.

12) No students should leave the school premises during school hours unless it has been notified to the Principal or Class Teacher, and must be entered in the school calendar, and must be duly signed by the class teachers and parents of the students.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

13) A student who uses unfair means at any test or examination is liable for stern action as per the rules and regulations in force.

14) Parents should compulsorily attend the P. T. A. meeting and collect the results of their ward after the respective examinations.

15) Responsibility of sending the ward to school in time and taking him back after school rests entirely on the Parents / Guardian.

16) School time will be 8:00 a.m. to 1:45 p.m. The responsibility of the school authorities ceases immediately after the school is closed.

17) Students should not wear any ornaments, watches or carry any valuable articles in school. The school authorities will not be responsible for the loss of any such articles.

18) Parents are requested to check the prospectus / calendar daily of their child and sign regularly.

19) Students should occupy their seats in the class before the warning bell.

20) RAGGING and BULLYING in strictly prohibited in the premises and if any student found engaged in such activities will be dealt strictly with.

21) Discipline is given great importance and must be compulsorily observed by all the students. Disobedience, misconduct, misbehaviour or failure to comply with any rules will be viewed seriously.

22) No special funds shall be collected on behalf of any school association without written permission from the Principal. The Principal is the ex-offcio president of all the school associations and her decision in all matters is final.

23) Students should not loiter in the school premises while the classes are in progress.

24) Smoking, drinking and use of tobacco products in the school premises are strictly prohibited.

25) Use of MOBILE PHONES, Tablet-PC, in school campus is strictly prohibited. If found, it will be confiscated. Confiscated items will be retained till end of the academic year.

A. Academic Year 2024-2025 to be divided into 2 Terms one ending in November-December and other in March-April:

Terminal Examination with 50% for First Term in the form of MCQs & one mark questions and 50% Second Term in the form of subjective questions. The Syllabus for the Academic Year 2024-2025 will be divided into two terms and topics will be divided accordingly by the Board of Studies. The Board will conduct the Examination at the end of each term on the basis of bifurcated syllabus.

B. Syllabus for the Board Examination 2024-2025 :

The syllabus for the Board examination 2021-22 will be the rationalized similar to that of the last academic year notified by Circular No.32 dated 08/07/2021.

C. Efforts will be made to make Internal Assessment/Practical/ Project work more credible and valid as per the guidelines to be notified by the Board to ensure fair distribution of marks.

DETAILS OF CURRICULUM TRANSACTION.

- Schools will continue teaching in Online mode till the authorities permit Offline mode of teaching in schools.
- Class X & XII Internal Assessment throughout the year irrespective of Term I and II would include three periodic Test of which the Third One would be creative one beside there would be practical work and other activities. That will also include end of topics or Unit test/exploratory Activities/Practical Project.
- Schools would create a student profile for all assessment undertaken over the year and retain the evidences in digital format.
- Board will facilitate schools to upload Marks of Internal Assessment on the Board's IT Platform.
- Guidelines for Internal Assessment for all subject will also be released along with the rationalized term-wise divided syllabus for the session 2024-2025. Additional resources like sample assessments, question banks, teacher training etc., for more reliable and valid Internal Assessment.

* INTERNAL TESTS 2024-2025 :

- First Internal Test (Formative Test) to be conducted by second week of August 2024. Duration will be of 01 hour.
- Second Internal Test (Formative Test) to be conducted by second week of October 2024. Duration will be of 01 hour.
- Third Internal Test (Innovative Test) in the form of presentation/ project / Practical / Unit Test / reading / group assignment. To commemorate India's 75 years of Independence and 60 years of Goa Liberation Day, students to submit an article or any activity on the progress or development of India & Goa at the State, National and International level as a part patriotism on the subject preferably on Education/ Agriculture/ Health / Science & Technology / IT / Economics/ History/ cooperation / Art & Culture etc.,. This activity will carry 10 marks out of 20 Marks of third test. This may be included in any one of the six subjects. Test to be completed mid-February 2025.

* TERMINAL EXAMS 2024-2025 :

First Terminal Exam:

- Paper will be in the form of MCQs based 01 mark questions to be conducted in November-December 2024 covering 50% of the portion and of 90 minutes duration.
- Exam will be conducted by the Board under the supervision of External Centre Conductors and Observers appointed by GBSHSE.
- The responses of students will be captured on OMR Sheets which after scanning may be directly uploaded at Board's Portal or alternately may be evaluated and marks obtained will be uploaded by the school on the very same day.
- Marks of the First Term Examination will contribute to the final overall score of the students.

Second Terminal Exam:

- Paper will be in the form of subjective questions (case based/situation based, short answer/long answer type) to be conducted in March-April 2025 covering 50% of the portion and of 90 minutes duration.
- Exam will be conducted by the Board at the Examination Centre fixed by the Board.
- Incase the situation is not conducive for normal descriptive Examination a 90 minutes MCQs based Exam will be conducted at the end of Term II also.
- Marks of the Second Term Examination would contribute to the final overall score of the students.

Passing Criteria is same as per Circular No. 19 Dated: 25th April 2012 and Circular No. 41 Dated: 03/11/2015.

* ASSESSMENT / EXAMINATION AS PER DIFFERENT SITUATIONS.

- A. In case the situation of the pandemic improves and students are able to come to schools or centres for taking the exams: Board would conduct Term I and Term II examinations at schools/centres and the theory marks will be distributed equally between the two exams.
- B. In case the situation of the pandemic forces complete closure of schools during November-December 2024 but Term II exams are held at schools or centres. Term I MCQ based examination would be done by students online/offline from home - in this case, the weightage of this exam for the final score would be reduced, and weightage of Term II exams will be increased for declaration of final result.
- C. In case the situation of the pandemic forces complete closure of schools during March-April 2025 but Term I exams are held at schools or centres. Results would be based on the performance of students on Term I MCQ based examination and internal assessments. The weightage of marks of Term I examination conducted by the Board will be increased to provide year end results of candidates.
- D. In case the situation of the pandemic forces complete closure of schools and Board conducted Term I and II exams are taken by the candidates from home in the session 2024-2025:

Results would be computed on the basis of the Internal Assessment/Practical/Project Work and Theory marks of Term-I and II exams taken by the candidate from home in Class X/XII subject to the moderation or other measures to ensure validity and reliability of the assessment.

In all the above cases, data analysis of marks of students will be undertaken to ensure the integrity of internal assessments and home based exams.

- The syllabus and Weightage to the topics at different Tests/Exams for class X & XII will be available shortly on Board's official website.
- The Head of the institution shall download the same from the official website of this Board for further necessary action.

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




